After months of preparation, tomorrow night marks the opening of Alex Da Corte and Jack Sloss' two-person exhibition LOVE EXPLOSION at Fleisher/Ollman Gallery. The reception will go from 6 until 8 o' clock, and promises to be an emotional and saturated affair. All are welcome.



Love Explosion is Alex Da Corte's first full-scale show in Philadelphia following recent solo exhibitions at Parisian Laundry in Montreal and the Stonefox Artspace in New York. He graduated from the University of the Arts in 2005. Jack Sloss first showed at Fleisher/Ollman in 2005's *Meatball* invitational and *From Time To Time* in 2006, following his relocation to Philadelphia from Chicago in 2005, where he had shown at the Chicago Cultural Center and Donald Young Gallery among many others.



The work in this show scampers from one emotional note to the next, from sexy to serene, abstruse, dark. A complete spectrum. Love and positivity imbues the work at every level. The gallery is blinking with energy flashes both figurative and literal, for there are many light works on display. There are photographs, too, and film, video, sculptures in bronze, plaster, plastic and found objects, and paintings. Tomorrow there will also be sculptures in cake.

That's about all there is to say. We look forward to seeing you tomorrow and through the month, where several of the works in the show will be evolving daily. There is a limited edition 40-page catalogue accompanying the exhibition featuring essays from Terre Thaemlitz, Gilles Deleuze, KRS-One, William Pym, and JW Goethe, along with many supplemental images and sketches.

All are encouraged to attend the Heartworks party immediately following the reception, where our friends Meg Baird, Gang Gang Dance, Douglas Armour, Chad Brown, Megawords DJs and Professor Murder (and more) will be performing live sets.
